









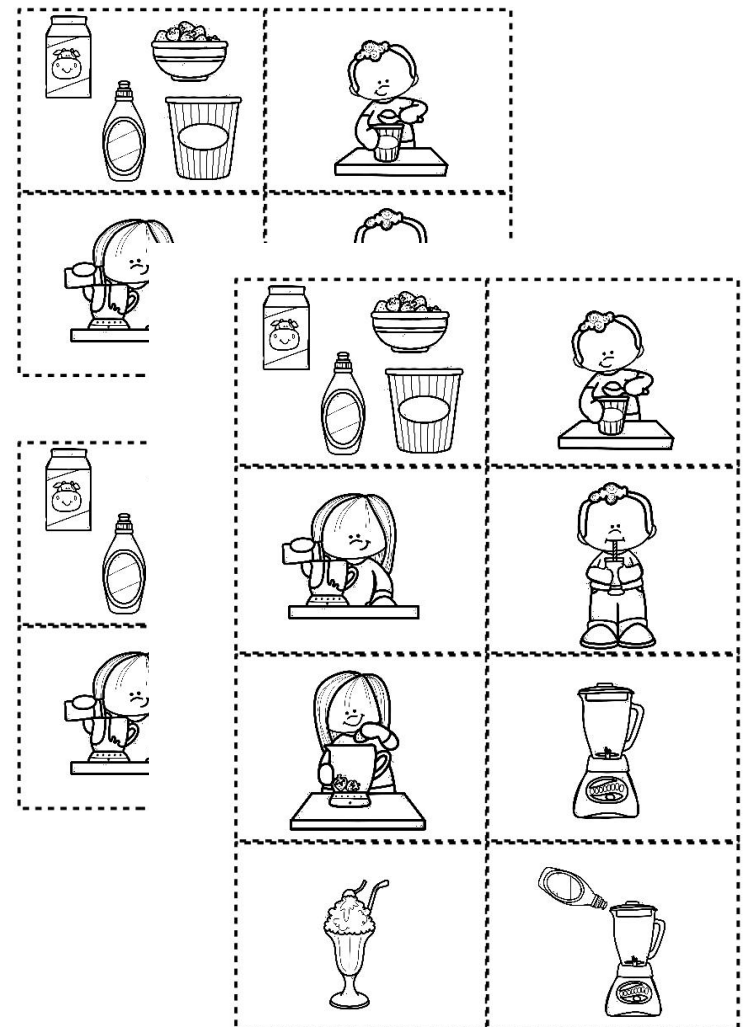
Cut & Glue Sequencing

Cut and glue the steps to make a milkshake. Then write about each step.




HOW TO MAKE A MILKSHAKE

Teaching Notes

Vocabulary Cards: Choose the vocabulary cards that work best for your students! These words can be used for this how-to writing activity, or for other writing activities.

These cards can also be cut apart from the picture to match the picture to the word!

Sequencing:

I have included several differentiated resources for sequencing.

* 4 step large color cards with word cards to sequence and if you'd like, match the word to the step. This is great for young learners, or as a warm up for the writing activity.

* 4 step cut and glue sequencing. You will see that on one sheet the directions say to cut and glue, and the other says to draw and write. You can even differentiate by having some students draw and write and having other students use the sequencing pictures.

* 8 step cut and paste/ draw and write- Just print the blank backside and choose the 8 step sequence cut outs.

* Step by step writing booklet- This is another great sequencing option if you'd like students to go into more detail. There is a cover, pages with the step numbers on top, or you can just add as many blank pages to your booklet as you'd like! Print, Staple, and cut in half to make two student booklets. Students can draw and write, or even use the cut and glue pieces to make the booklet.

* Extra- Opinion response- This is a great extension activity.
