
CUT & PASTE LIFE CYCLE

Cut out the circle. Cut on the dotted lines.


Then attach it to your life cycle spinner with a brass fastener



TEACHING NOTES

This resource is perfect to use with any book or video you have in your classroom about the life cycle of a turkey.

It includes basic life cycle vocabulary cards which are great for a word wall or to support with writing tasks. You can even cut the picture apart from the words and have the students match the pictures to the words.

I have included a basic web and also a KWL chart as options for students to record learning.

There are a variety of choices for showing what students have learned about the life cycle of a goose.

*Use the ¼ page pictures and words to create their own group life cycle. It is fun to do this as a precursor to the other life cycle activities, which are more independent.

*Students use the one page life cycle sheet or life cycle booklet to write and draw about the life cycle. (note that there is a one sided 4 step version and a version to print 2 sided for a 6 step version.

*Students cut and glue the picture onto the one page life cycle sheet where they can write and color or into the booklet template.

*Life Cycle Wheel (write, color, cut, fasten). This is great for oral retell of the cycle of a turkey. This is also offered in a 4 step or 6 step format. Each has a version to label and draw, and one just to label.

**Note this really is a cycle! It's good to keep this in mind when thinking about student work on the one page activity or the booklet! Some students may start with a different step, but as long as it goes in order, it's correct!
