Place a ball of dough or pompom on each week How many wheels are on the buses












Name Writing & Color Yellow Practice



My Yellow Bus

For young children, you may write with a highlighter and have them trace, or even write the letters of their name on small cut up pieces of paper so they can glue the letters in order.

If the children you're working with can't write at all, write their names in the box and talk about the letters as you write.

Then they can use the color yellow to paint the bus

Focus on: color recognition, name recognition, spelling/writing name, fine motor development, hand eye coordination.







Cut, Count, Sort!

Cut out the pieces. Sort them putting buses in one pile and kids in another pile. You can also paste them onto 2 different sheets if you'd like.





Kids & Bus Sort

*Kids And Buses:

Cut out the small bus and kid pieces. Sort them into a pile/page with buses and one with kids. Introduce as many as you see appropriate for the children you're working with! For example, you may start with only 2 of each, or you may give each child a whole stack!

If you'd like, you can have the chlildren sort in a line and count how many of each they have.



Happy Kids on the Bus

There are two options for this activity.

One includes using stickers on the full color mat, and the other includes coloring the bus and drawing kids with happy faces on the windows.

Discuss what a happy face looks like. Draw a basic happy face..


Then color the bus picture. Draw or place happy kids on the bus.

This activity helps with sensory development, emotional awareness, and motor

development.

*Kids And Buses: Cut out the small bus and kid pieces. Sort them into a pile/page with buses and one with kids. Introduce as many as you see appropriate for your little one! For example, you may start with only 2 of are for your nitie one; for example, you may start with each.


This activity helps with sorting, observation skills, categorizing







Shapes, Explore, Create



Shape Bus!

Print the shapes on cardstock (I like to print on yellow).

If the children you're working with can cut them out, you can have them cut. Otherwise, you can cut out the shapes.

Discuss which shapes the children see, and what they notice.

Then challenge them to put the shapes together to create something.

After they have had time to explore, ask them to create a bus using the shapes. Display a picture of a bus if needed.

Glue the shapes together.

Invite children to draw rectangular windows on the bus.



This activity helps with spatial awareness, shape recongition, problem solving.
