

Vocabulary & Sequencing Terms

Great for word walls or to support student writing!




4 Step Sequencing

Great for young learners or as a model warm up!




4 or 8 Step Sequencing!

Teaching Votes

Vocabulary Cards: Choose the vocabulary cards that work best for your students! These words can be used for this how-to writing activity, or for other writing activities relating to plants and gardens.

Sequencing:

I have included several differentiated resources for sequencing.

* 4 step large color cards with word cards to sequence and if you'd like, match the word to the step. This is great for young learners, or as a warm up for the writing activity.

*4 step cut and glue sequencing. You will see that on one sheet the directions say to cut and glue, and the other says to draw and write. You can even differentiate by having some students draw and write and having other students use the sequencing pictures.

*8 step cut and glue- This is another great way to differentiate. You can either have students draw and write, or cut and glue the 8 step sequencing pictures. If you'd like to complete this, just print the blank 4 step page as your back side of whichever sequencing activity you'd like students to do!

*Step by step writing booklet- This is another great sequencing option if you'd like students to go into more detail. There are 2 covers to choose from, pages with the step numbers on top, or you can just add as many blank pages to your booklet as you'd like! Print, Staple, and cut in half to make two student booklets.

*Extra- My favorite Part- This is a great follow up activity for students to do after they have practiced sequencing. It is also a great time for them to apply relevant vocabulary!
